# DURATION OF THE COURSE AND CREDITS

This one week program will have about 20 Sessions of theory and practice. The timing would preferably from 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. There would be a written evaluation in case of those who wish to earn the credit for this programme.

Credit Transfer: As per the MHRD & UGC guidelines, this course carries one credit and same can be received by the participants on the successful completion of the course. The credit transfer in case of NLU, Delhi students would be done in their existing degree programme. The student from outside have to identify a compatible course from their institution for the purpose of credit transfer. This academic year she continues to serve as Lecturer in Law at the University of Chicago, a Principal Investigator of U.S. Supreme Court Database project, and co-editor of the Journal of Law, Economics, & Organization, among other professional positions.



# SHORT COURSE ON EMPIRICAL LEGAL RESEARCH METHODS

The study of Empirical Legal Research in India is yet to begin. The impressive array of National Law Schools across the country has yet to embrace the active applications of Empirical Methods to address the complex questions of policy and practice in the legal studies. There are hardly any systematic opportunity and programmes in the Law schools to train the legal scholars in the field of Empirical Legal Research. The National Law University Delhi under the UGC initiated Global Initiative of Academic Network (GIAN) has invited the renowned Empirical Legal Research scholar Professor Lee Epstein for a short course. This course introduces students to different methods of legal research like doctrinal research, empirical research, quantitative research, qualitative research, sample survey, case study etc. We will consider how to choose the appropriate method of conducting research out of the many available options. Studying research methodology means acquiring a scientific edge to your thinking, analysis and writing. Thinking and writing scientifically has immense values. This course is a skill development program where the fusion of knowledge with practice of research methodology would be the defining characteristic. The participant of the course would learn and apply all the facets of research methodology. This course has transforming potential for the participants. It will let the participants bring lot of objectivity and factual orientation in the way they think and write. The sessions of the course are in double mode which would require the participants to visit the field for collecting data and analyzing it for writing the assigned task. The participants will also have the opportunity to analyses data using SPSS. SPSS is a computerized data analysis programme. Cross-culture and contemporary practices along with ethical issues will be given special emphasis throughout the course.

### **OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE**

The primary objectives of the course are as follows:

- To introduce participants to various modes of legal research
- To learn the selection process of appropriate research method
- To gain knowledge of data analysis
- To become skilled at using computerize data analysis programme
- To study the technique of effective communication of the result of empirical study
- To train participant in report writing
