# **Corporate Governance in India**

# Overview

The concept of corporate governance has acquired tremendous significance in recent years. It represents the set of norms by which companies are directed and controlled. While the traditional focus on governance issues had been confined to the Western hemisphere, there has been a great deal of interest generated more recently in the study of Asian economies such as India.

This course is intended to provide an understanding of the specific governance issues involved in Indian companies. It examines the peculiarities such as the concentrated ownership structures where business families or the state tend to exercise significant control. A study of India (and a comparison with other Asian jurisdictions) also provides an elegant framework to analyze the influence of legal regimes in business and finance generally and in corporate governance specifically.

This course examines various aspects of corporate governance in India along with a comparative perspective. The course will focus on corporate governance mechanisms such as board independence, audit committee, managerial remuneration, regulation of related party transactions, shareholder activism and corporate social responsibility, among others. Newer themes such as shareholder activism and corporate social responsibility will be explored. These will be discussed in the light of the legal position set out by the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules promulgated there under. The enforcement of corporate governance norms by regulators such as the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) will also form the subject-matter of study.

There will be equal emphasis on the theoretical components of corporate governance as well as their application in practice. Although the legal position in India will be used as a framework, the course will compare the Indian position with that prevailing in other leading jurisdictions, both in Asia and in other parts of the world.

The teaching methodology would follow a combination of lecture and class discussion, with the Socratic Method exploited to the extent necessary. Each class will also contain active involvement by participants in the class discussion.
