

# HISTORIES OF CITY PLANNING

## Overview

**Guru Ram Das School of Planning, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, India** is organizing a five day intensive short course on Histories of City Planning from 11-15 December, 2017 under GIAN (**Global Initiatives of Academic Networks**).

The participants will have exposure and understanding about city history and its implications for current and future urban spatial paradigms. They will be able to analyze spatial design and planning with new perspectives which will enable them to undertake further research on advanced topics in city history and urban planning in general.
