

About GIAN:

Course Overview

Systemic Functional Grammar (SFG) is an applicable linguistics. Its theory is comprehensive, semantically, paradigmatic and textual. M.A.K. Halliday is the chief exponent and M.I.M Matthiessen has been the co-exponent of the SFG. According to Halliday, Language is a social semiotic. System is a network of sets of options in a given context. Function is the significant relation among the constituent units across all the domains, levels and ranks of language. Grammar is the shared experience of the speech community. Metafunctions are spectral confluences overlapping each other in one and the same clause of language. These metafunctions are Ideational, Interpersonal and Textual. SFG describes language at both the planes of expression and content in a given context. It gives us description of entire text in context, not just the description at the clause level. Therefore, the course aims to explore systemic functional profile of Marathi and to review SFG Model and Grammar of Marathi and apply it to Marathi primarily to describe its Lexicogrammar, Metafunctions, Grammatical Metaphor and Text in context. The course will enable the participants in the discipline of Multilingual Systemic Functional

Description (MSFD), and which may be further extended to other Indian languages. As India is a linguistic area, the outcomes of the course on MSFD of Indian Languages may have very innovative implications for Educational Linguistics, Computational Linguistics, Translation Studies, Artificial Intelligence, Cognitive Linguistics and Language Policy and Planning.

- To attempt Systemic Functional Profile of Marathi.
- To understand the methodology of SFG in theory and practice.
- To overview the Systemic Functional Profiles of the Select Languages.
- To initiate SFG forum for MSFD of Indian Languages progressively.
